



## THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

I. Thou shalt have no other gods before Me.

II. Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate Me: and showing mercy unto thousands of them that love Me and keep My commandments.

III. Thou shalt not take the Name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh His Name in vain.

IV. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: for in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day, and hallowed it.

V. Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.

VI. Thou shalt not kill.

VII. Thou shalt not commit adultery.

VIII. Thou shalt not steal.

IX. Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

X. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor anything that is thy neighbour's.

## The Secret of Bible Study

Pass IT on - Seek to tell somebody, your family, neighbour or friend, what you have learned and perhaps your listener will start to do the same thing as you. You will surely soon after have the beginnings of a Sabbath school.

## SABBATH STUDY MARCH 28, 2026

### THE SECOND COMING OF JESUS

**Scripture Reading: Revelation 19:1-16.**

**Golden Text: 1 Thessalonians 4:16.**

1. What great promise did Jesus leave all mankind? John 14:1-3.
2. What are we told by Matthew and Luke of Jesus second coming? Matthew 24:30; Luke 21:27-31.
3. What was taught in the New Testament church on Jesus second coming? 1 Thessalonians 4:16, Acts 3:19, 20; Revelation 1:7.
4. What does Paul teach us will happen to the faithful at Jesus coming? 1 Corinthians 15:51-54.
5. The world churches teach that the spirit of the dead is already in heaven, what does the Bible teach? 1 Thessalonians 4:16; Matthew 16:27; 1 Corinthians 15:52, 53.
6. Will Jesus' return be secret or visible? Acts 1:9-11; Revelation 1:7; Matthew 24:30; Matthew 26:64; Zechariah 14:5.
7. Why is Jesus coming back? John 5:28, 29; 1 Corinthians 15:22, 23.
8. Paul wrote Timothy about what he and all the saints have to look forward to. 2 Timothy 4:8.
9. Can there be any doubt that Jesus' return is a visible event? Revelation 1:7; Matthew 24:27.

## ***SABBATH STUDY MARCH 21, 2026***

### **STATE OF THE DEAD**

**Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:12-58.**

**Golden Text: Romans 5:14.**

1. What was the punishment given if mankind disobeyed God? Genesis 2:17; James 1:15.
2. What does Job tell us about the state of the dead? Job 7:9; 14:13; 17:13; 21:32.
3. What of the thief on the cross? Jesus told him that day he would be in paradise with Him. Luke 23:43. Was Jesus in paradise that day? John 20:17.
4. How do we know that was not the same day? 1 Corinthians 15:4; Acts 10:40; Luke 24:46; 18:33; 9:22.
5. What does Solomon have to say about the dead? Ecclesiastes 9:5, 6, 10.
6. What of David in the book of Psalms? Psalms 146:4.
7. The churches teach that the good are in heaven, the bad in hell what does the Bible say? John 5:28, 29.
8. Again, returning to Solomon and Job how do they explain the end of all living things? Ecclesiastes 3:20; Job 34:15.
9. Finally, lets look at Peter's first message to the New Testament church on the state of the dead, understood by these apostles. What is it? Acts 2:29-32, 34.

### **KNOWING THE CHRIST**

4. Does Jesus' statement support what Isaiah said in question 3? John 10:16.
5. Who was the first to acknowledge the baby Jesus as the anointed? Luke 2:25-38.
6. What is Paul's testimony of who saw Jesus after his resurrection? 1 Corinthians 15:4-8.
7. How do we know that Jesus died on a T type cross? John 20:25. Pay attention to the plural nails.
8. Was there one cloth that covered Jesus? John 20:5-7.
9. What does Jesus say about being decisive? Matthew 5:37.
10. What is our goal? Philippians 3:10.

## ***SABBATH STUDY JANUARY 10, 2026***

### **KNOWING THE DISCIPLES**

**Scripture Reading: John 15.**

**Golden Text: John 15:20.**

1. What was the background of Jesus' disciples? Matthew 9:9; Matthew 4:21, 22; Matthew 4:18, 19.
2. How many disciples were Apostles? Luke 6:13.
3. Were all of Jesus' apostles faithful? Matthew 26:19-21.
4. Were Jesus' apostles able to do all things from the beginning? Matthew 17:17-19.
5. Before the gift of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, did the apostles believe they were willing to die in Jesus' service? Matthew 26:35. Would they be? Matthew 26:34.
6. Did the apostles fully understand the message while still in the presence of the living Christ? Luke 9:45; John 12:16.
7. When were the eyes of the apostles opened to the gospel message? Acts 2:1-7.
8. Was Judas replaced after Jesus' resurrection? Acts 1:16, 17; 20-26.
9. What are we told takes place with Judas, and who replaced him? Acts 1:16-20.
10. What is the criteria to be an apostle and should we consider this to be still applicable today? Acts 1: 21-23.

## ***SABBATH STUDY MARCH 14, 2026***

### **TRUSTING GOD**

6. What happened to Moses and Aaron for not believing God? Numbers 20:12.

8. By the words of Jesus can one enter the new Kingdom without being baptized? John 3:5-7.
9. Finally, what did Jesus example to us about baptism? Matthew 3:11-16.

4. Was the man of God's prophecy fulfilled pertaining to that altar? 1 Kings 13:5.
5. Did Jeroboam request that the man of God call upon God to heal him? 1 Kings 13:6.
6. What did the king offer the man of God, and what was the man of God's answer? 1 Kings 13:7-9.
7. Did the man of God have a clear understanding of his instructions from God from the previous scripture?
8. How did the man of God return? 1 Kings 13:10.
9. Who heard of these things and what did he do? 1 Kings 13:11-15.

## ***SABBATH STUDY JANUARY 31, 2026***

### **THE SIGN OF JESUS**

**Scripture Reading: Matthew 12:1-41.**

**Golden Text: Matthew 12:40.**

1. What did the scribes and Pharisees ask for? Matthew 12:38.
2. What does Jesus answer back, and is it a specific event? Matthew 12:39, 40.
3. When Jesus later refers to this prophecy how does he refer to it? Matthew 16:4.
4. What is another example of this timeline, and how would you compare it? Joshua 5:10-12; Esther 4:16.
5. The two men on the road to Emmaus say this is the third day since these things happened, at what time is this? Luke 24:21, 12, 13.
6. What do these men say the length of time they are speaking of is, one day or more? Luke 24:14, 18.
7. What are all the events they speak of? Luke 24:19-21. It would seem they have counted from his very capture.
8. How do we know there were two Sabbaths that week? Luke 23:55, 56; Mark 16:1. The one tells us spices were purchased after the Sabbath the other states they were prepared before the Sabbath.
9. What were these two Sabbaths? John 19:14, 31; Matthew 28:1.
10. From what we've read how do you calculate the Lord's death. Considering that the women bought the spices after the Sabbath and prepared them before a Sabbath? A high day and a seventh day.

5. What does John record for us on Jesus' return? Revelation 1:7.
6. What did the brother of Jesus instruct us on about Jesus' return? James 5:7, 8.
7. Did the angels speak of the return of Jesus? Acts 1:9-11.
8. What are we told of Jesus' return? 1 John 2:28; 3:2; 1 Peter 1:7; 1 Timothy 6:14; 2 Timothy 4:1.
9. How many ways will Jesus appear at His return? Revelation 14:14; Revelation 19:11-16.
10. How do we stay prepared for Jesus' return? Matthew 24:42, 43; 1 Thessalonians 5:6.
